

**CITY OF WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE**  
**Service, Safety and Recreation Committee Minutes**  
**March 4, 2019**

The Service, Safety and Recreation Committee met in the Lower Level Conference Room, located at 105 N. Main Street, on Monday, March 4, 2019 at 4:00 PM. Mr. Ted Hawk presided and those in attendance were, Mr. Steve Jennings, Council Member, Ms. Kendra Hernandez, Council Member, Mr. Steve Shiltz, Council Member, Mr. Dale Lynch, Council Member, Mr. Jim Chrisman, Council Chairperson, Mr. Ron Sockman, Service Director, Mr. Brian Hottinger, Police Chief, Mr. Tim Downing, Fire Chief, and Mr. Joe Denen, City Manager.

1. The Committee benefited from a general report of the Washington Police Department and Washington Fire Department. Chief Downing advised the Committee regarding the upcoming Box65-Fayette County Unit Fundraiser.
2. The Administration advised the Committee that Police contract negotiations had been completed.
3. The Committee benefited from a review of Service Department projects.
4. The Committee benefited from a review of the Washington Avenue Project. The Administration advised the Committee that landing and sidewalk preparation work would begin on Washington Avenue from Elm Street to Clearview Avenue.
5. The Committee recommended that legislation be brought to Council approving the additional funding to ODOT for the Washington Avenue project. The Committee noted the lowest bid was only 2-1/2 % higher than the project estimate; said amount being \$179,656.00.
6. The Administration advised the Committee of a request for input from the Rose Avenue Community Center concerning parking.
7. The Committee recommended that legislation be brought to Council to accept the bid from Ohio Cat for the purchase of a 2019 Front End Loader.
8. The Committee recommended that legislation be brought to Council to accept the bid from Rush Truck for the purchase of a 2019 Dump Truck.
9. The Committee noted a concern regarding traffic issues at the intersection of Ste. Rte. 753 and Ste. Rte. 62. The Committee recommended that a conversation proceed about the intersection.

10. The Administration advised the Committee that interviews had begun for the Street Laborer position.
11. The Administration advised the Committee that applications were being taken for the open position at the Water Treatment Plant.
12. The Committee discussed the proposed gas tax increase.
13. The Administration advised the Committee of a request for permission for the use of the Judy Chapel in a film production. The Committee recommended permission be granted.
14. The Committee discussed pedestrian concerns near Prime Meats and Deli.
